- 6. Financial Review October 2024

Laura Prichard

- Salaries year to date through the month of October were over budget \$44k. There were 5 pay periods in October.
- Landfill and Yard Waste for the month of October was \$380k. Total over budget YTD \$121k.
- Total disposal tonnage for October was 8,236 tons for a cost of \$380k.
- Yard waste cost for October was \$168k.
- Fleet cost for October was \$206k, this was over budget \$16k.
- As of October 31, 2024, we were over budget \$176k. Capital expense
 YTD was under budget \$53k and operations expense was over budget
 \$229k.
- Tax Collection in October was \$226,188, last October was \$199,990.
 We are \$23k ahead last year's collections.
- Bank balances at the end of October were \$4,715,074.
